Simple Lifestyle: True Riches in Christ

In his autobiography *Just As I Am*, Billy Graham recounts an unforgettable experience in the Caribbean islands that revealed what true greatness really is. He and his wife Ruth were invited to lunch by one of the world's wealthiest men. Despite his yacht, private plane, and immense riches, the man confessed through tears, *"I am the most miserable man in the world."*

Later that same day, they visited a poor English pastor, a widower who lovingly cared for his two invalid sisters. Though he had almost no money, he radiated joy, declaring, *"I am the happiest man on this island."* Billy and Ruth knew instantly who the richer man truly was—wealth is not measured by possessions, but by character and joy in Christ.

This truth closely relates to the **seventh ethos of FMPB: "Simple Lifestyle"**—a commitment to live with only the indispensable needs in personal and organizational life (1 Timothy 6:6). Simplified living may seem out of context in today's world, but it actually frees us to focus on what truly matters: Kingdom work. As Hebrews 12:1 reminds us, *"Let us lay aside every weight ... and run with endurance the race that is set before us."*

Living simply impacts every area of life—our time, energy, health, availability, and even our spending habits. These resources are either invested in Kingdom priorities or wasted on distractions. Scripture reminds us, *"No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him"* (2 Timothy 2:4).

Hand in hand with simple living is **contentment**. The path to contentment begins with **gratitude**—recognizing God's blessings and choosing to be satisfied with what we already have. In a world chasing after the "next big thing," gratitude shifts our focus from what is lacking to what is abundant. Practical habits like keeping a gratitude diary help nurture this mindset. In contrast, comparison breeds restlessness and robs us of joy.

The apostle Paul modelled this life, declaring, *"I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am"* (Philippians 4:11-13). Even more profoundly, *Jesus Himself is the ultimate example: "Jesus was born with nothing, lived with little, and died with nothing. His simplicity was not accidental. Jesus could have chosen any standard, yet He chose to live simple."*

From the General Secretary...

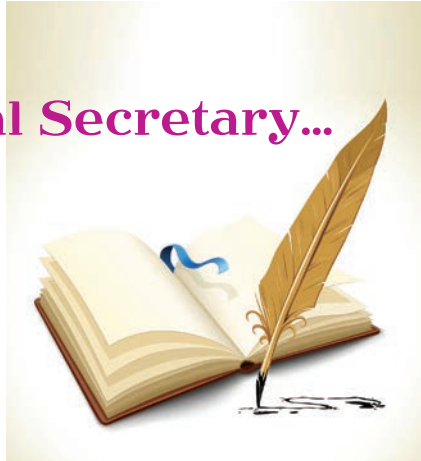
When Jesus sent out His disciples, He commanded them: *“Take nothing for the journey no staff, no bag, no bread, no money, no extra shirt”* (Luke 9:3). In this radical instruction, Jesus showed that the Gospel mission flows best through lives unencumbered by excess. Simplicity was not an option; it was part of their witness.

A simple lifestyle has always been central to God’s mission. Abraham left the securities of Ur to follow God’s call into the unknown (Genesis 12:1). The early church shared everything they had so that none were in need (Acts 2:44 - 45). Paul declared, *“I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation”* (Philippians 4:12). In every generation, the advance of the Gospel has been carried by men and women who lived lightly on earth so they could walk freely in obedience.

Today’s world tells us to accumulate, upgrade, and compete. Yet the Kingdom of God calls us to release, simplify, and serve. A simple lifestyle is not about deprivation but about devotion. It frees our hearts from the grip of materialism so that our hands are open to give, and our feet are ready to go where Christ sends us.

The Beatitudes and the Call to Simple Kingdom Living

When Jesus stood on the mountainside and taught the Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1–12), He was not giving a list of moral suggestions but unveiling a radically different way of life. His words overturned the world’s standards of power, wealth, and ambition, and invited His disciples into humility, mercy, purity, and surrender. At its heart, the Beatitudes describe a simple lifestyle of one that is uncluttered by possessions, free from pride, and wholly devoted to God’s mission.



Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

To be poor in spirit is to confess that we are utterly dependent on God. The world teaches us to build security through wealth and possessions, but Jesus calls us to a life of radical trust. Simplicity begins here by choosing God-sufficiency over self-sufficiency. When we let go of pride in possessions, we discover true riches in Christ. In mission, this posture allows us to go wherever God sends, unburdened by fear of losing what we own.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Those who live simply mourn the brokenness of the world rather than numbing themselves with comforts. They grieve over injustice, poverty, and souls without Christ. Yet God Himself draws near to comfort them. True mission begins with mourning by allowing our hearts to break for what breaks God’s heart. Out of this grief flows compassion and a willingness to serve sacrificially.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Meekness is not weakness but strength surrendered to God. The meek live with open hands, not clutching possessions or power.

Simplicity is meekness in action by choosing service over status, stewardship over self-indulgence. God entrusts His mission to the meek, who inherit not through grasping but through surrender.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

Simplicity clears space for the deepest hunger to see God's righteousness on earth. When we set aside distractions and material cravings, we long for what truly satisfies that is God's justice, His truth, His Kingdom. This hunger drives mission by feeding the hungry, defending the oppressed, and proclaiming the Gospel.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Mercy thrives when our lives are not chained by greed. Simplicity loosens our grip, freeing us to notice and meet the needs of others. The merciful disciple uses resources not to build comfort but to bless the broken. In mission, mercy is a testimony of the cross by extending Christ's compassion to the least and the lost.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

Purity is a single-hearted devotion to God. Simplicity clears away the clutter that divides our loyalties. When status and possessions lose their grip, our vision of God sharpens. Mission flourishes through pure-hearted disciples who seek nothing for themselves but only God's glory.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Peacemakers cannot be driven by competition or greed. Simplicity fosters peace by valuing relationships over possessions, reconciliation over rivalry. In mission, peacemakers embody

Christ's reconciling love, showing the world that we are children of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Living the Beatitudes often means clashing with the world's values. Simplicity may look foolish in a culture of consumption. Yet those who endure opposition for Christ's sake taste the reality of His Kingdom. Missionaries across centuries have borne loss and hardship, knowing that eternal reward outweighs earthly comfort.

Mission history is filled with men and women who showed that the Gospel advances through simplicity. William Carey lived frugally so that resources could be poured into Bible translation. Mother Teresa embraced simplicity to walk alongside the poorest. Pandita Ramabai laid aside personal comfort to serve India's widows and orphans. Their lives remind us that simplicity is power that is power to serve, to give, and to love without reserve.

In our own times, the life of our beloved Patrick Joshua Annan, who authored the ethos of FMPB, stands as a shining example of Beatitude living. He chose to live in a modest home and valued contentment over comfort. His humility, transparent lifestyle, and servant-leadership reflected meekness and purity of heart. He often reminded us that mission does not move forward through wealth or prestige but through surrendered lives. Like the early disciples, he carried the Gospel with uncluttered hands and an uncluttered heart.

The world needs to see Christians whose joy does not rest on possessions but on Christ. A simple lifestyle is itself a missional witness a declaration that Jesus is enough. The Beatitudes are not ideals for the few but a

calling for every disciple. To live simply is to embody them by choosing humility over pride, mercy over greed, purity over compromise, May our homes, churches, and movements embrace this call. For when we live simply, the Gospel shines more brightly, and the mission advances more freely.

Mission Awareness Programs in Mumbai:

These meetings ignited fresh passion among believers in the city. Many were challenged to lift their eyes beyond personal concerns and to see the vast fields waiting for transformation. We thank God for those who committed to pray.

IMA National Leaders Consultation at Secunderabad:

This gathering brought together leaders from across the nation. The consultation was a space of listening to one another, discerning God's purposes, and strengthening partnerships for mission in challenging times. Reform, Revive and Rivet were reaffirmed towards standards of Excellence.

Anbin Sangamam - SCAN Family Gathering in Chennai:

Christian Businessmen Families of our supporters and partners came together in a joyful atmosphere of fellowship. It was a time of mutual encouragement, worship, and strengthening the bond that unites us as one mission family. Truly, love, prayer and unity are the backbone of our movement.

Management Committee Meeting: This was not merely an administrative gathering but a sacred space of prayer and discernment. Important decisions for the mission's progress were taken with humility and dependence on God's wisdom. We continue to see how governance, when rooted in prayer, becomes a channel for God's guidance.

Zonal and Regional Secretaries' Meet in Bengaluru:

Our mission leaders from across the regions came together to review, realign, and refresh the mission strategies. The fellowship of leaders was marked by

transparency, unity of spirit, and a deep burden for the unreached. Such times strengthen the backbone of the organization.

Vision Casting Pastors' Conferences in Telangana:

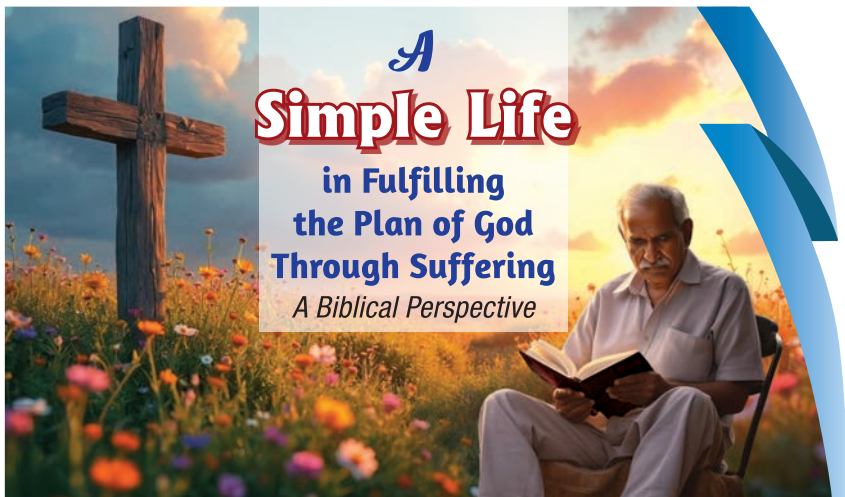

My warm greetings in the sweet name of our Lord Jesus Christ, who came as the Son of Man to reveal the beauty of a simple life!

This October, the missionaries, partners, and beneficiaries of the Friends Missionary Prayer Band-especially the readers of Friends Focus magazine-are reflecting on one of our cherished ethos: “Simple Lifestyle.”

But what does *simple lifestyle* really mean? It is a way of living without luxury-minimizing unnecessary possessions, living in harmony with creation, and being content with what God provides. For FMPB, it is a commitment to live with only the essentials, both personally and in ministry. Our guiding verse is:

“Godliness with contentment is great gain.” (1 Timothy 6:6)

To understand this, let us consider three biblical examples of people who lived simple lives and fulfilled God’s plan-together with contemporary missionary witnesses who followed the same path.

Simple Life in the Transformation of God’s Chosen People

King Ahab led Israel into deep sin-marrying Jezebel, serving Baal, building altars for idols, and persecuting the prophets of the Lord (1 Kings 16:30-33; 18:4,13,19). The people were caught in a dilemma-torn between worshipping Baal and the Lord (18:21).

Not only did King Ahab marry Jezebel, the daughter of the king of Sidon, but he also served Baal, the god of his wife’s people. He worshiped Baal, built a temple and an altar for him in Samaria (1 Kings 16:30-32), and even set up an Asherah pole, provoking the Lord to anger (16:33). Furthermore, he supported 450 prophets of Baal and 400 prophets of Asherah, who were sustained by Jezebel’s provision even during the famine (18:19). Not only that, Jezebel killed the prophets of the Lord (18:4,13). The people of Israel during this time were caught in a dilemma: should they follow the Lord or Baal? For a long time, they wavered between two opinions (18:21). In the midst of this spiritual crisis, the Lord used His servant Elijah in a remarkable way to bring

revival among His people. Why do we call Elijah a wonderful prophet?

- ◆ He stayed in the humble home of a widow in Zarephath, sharing her last meal and witnessing God's miraculous provision (17:8-16).
- ◆ When the widow's son died of illness, Elijah prayed fervently over the boy's body in the upper room, and God raised him to life. The same widow who had once questioned him now bore witness that he was truly a man of God (17:17-24).
- ◆ He lived by the brook Cherith, sustained only by the Lord through ravens (17:3-6).
- ◆ During the famine, he stayed with a widow who was preparing her last meal, and by God's command, he provided for her household so that they did not perish (17:8-16).
- ◆ He stood boldly before kings and palace officials with divine authority (18:7-8,19-20).
- ◆ The revival of the people of Israel-who had fallen in their spiritual life and were wavering between two opinions-and the destruction of the false prophets should serve as a model for the simple life of today's ministers and for a ministry fulfilled through the church (1 Kings 18:37-40).

Elijah's simplicity and dependence on God also inspired others-Obadiah, who sheltered 100 prophets in caves (18:4), and the widow of Zarephath, who shared her little with God's servant.

In FMPB's history, leaders like **Mr. P. D. Pandian** followed this same spirit. Living on a modest salary with his wife and four children, buying clothes for them from second-hand markets, he still supported 12 missionaries

faithfully. His life stands as a shining example of godly simplicity.

Simple Life in the Transformation of Pharisees and Jewish Traditionalists

Christ's suffering, death, resurrection, and appearances to His disciples confirmed the universal plan of salvation. His ascension then ushered in a new unity among the redeemed. On the day of Pentecost, the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit and set themselves wholeheartedly to fulfill the Great Commission given in Acts 1:8.

Following the model of Jesus' ministry (Matt. 4:23-24), the chief apostles-Peter and John-carried out both the ministry of preaching (Acts 2:13-42; 3:12-26; 4:8-13; 5:19-21; 10:27-48) and the ministry of problem-solving: bringing freedom from sin (Acts 2:37-38), deliverance from the devil and incurable diseases (Acts 3:6-8; 5:14-16; 9:32,34), and even deliverance from death (Acts 9:40-41).

As a result, the believers-grateful for God's mighty works-sold their lands and possessions and laid the proceeds at the apostles' feet (Acts 2:45; 4:34-37). In the midst of such abundant blessings, the apostles' simple lifestyle becomes a powerful example for us today.

How can we recognize or measure this simple life style? What are its benchmarks?

- ◆ Living for the common good without personal gain - "Silver and gold I do not have" (Acts 3:6).
- ◆ Considering Jesus as their only treasure - "What I have I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk" (Acts 3:6). This reflects the promise of Numbers 18:20: "I am your share and your inheritance."

- ◆ Refusing to spend offerings on personal comfort - Instead of using the money given by believers for lodging, they stayed in the homes of partners and identified themselves as strangers and pilgrims (Acts 1:13; 4:23; 9:32-43; 10:25,48; 12:12; 1 Peter 1:2,17).
- ◆ Distributing resources for the benefit of others - The wealth laid at the apostles' feet was used to bless those in need, not stored for their own future.
- ◆ Building a new Spirit-filled society - marked by three key characteristics:
 - **A spotless community** (Acts 2:37-42; 9:35,42; 10:43-48).
 - **A defectless community** where no one lacked anything (Acts 2:44-45; 4:34-35).
 - **A compassionate community** that shared material goods with the needy and brought the sick to be healed in Jesus' name (Acts 5:14-16; 9:38-41).

In the same way, the communities revived through the missionary work of FMPB-spotless, united, and compassionate-stand as living witnesses of a simple lifestyle. They shared their belongings, lived sacrificially, and supported one another in Christ.

History gives us many such examples:

- ◆ The pioneering missionaries **Mr. Haris Hilton** and **Mr. Esaw and family**, who laid the foundation for revival in Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri districts, are remembered for their simple lives.
- ◆ The **Gonda mission field** in Uttar Pradesh, which began as a Bible correspondence center, later became a missionary training center, and today houses a children's home for believers' children-this legacy is a testimony to Dr. Greaves' simple life.
- ◆ Communities like the **Kukna and Varli** in Gujarat, the **Malto and Santhal** in

Jharkhand, and nearly **300 revived communities across India** all stand as historical witnesses to the simple lifestyle of FMPB.

Simple Life in the Transformation of the Gentiles - Paul and Barnabas

While Paul and Barnabas were serving as representatives of the church at Antioch, they were called by the Holy Spirit to serve as cross-cultural missionaries. In response, the church at Antioch sent them out with prayer (Acts 13:1-4).

They followed the example of Jesus in both life and ministry-preaching the gospel (Acts 13:5, 14-43; 14:1,21-22) and addressing human problems: bringing deliverance to the lame (Acts 14:8-10), deliverance from demonic oppression (Acts 16:16-18), healing the sick (Acts 19:11-12), and even raising the dead (Acts 20:9-12).

The simple lifestyle of these miracle-working apostles-Paul and Barnabas-continues to speak into the lives of modern Christians today.

- ◆ **Using God-given skills to advance the gospel without burdening others** - Paul supported himself through tentmaking while dedicating the Sabbath to God's work (Acts 18:1-5; 1 Cor. 9:18). In today's context of trials and pressures, Christian professionals are encouraged to live simply, save resources, and use their skills to serve God without extravagant spending. Some people of God even continue their ministry by maintaining secular work-government or private-so that, through their simple lifestyle, they may reach people of other cultures and fulfill God's plan.
- ◆ **Tribulations and shortcomings embraced as holy expressions of**

simplicity - Paul's willingness to endure suffering and to live contentedly without murmuring is a model of godly simplicity (Phil. 4:11-14).

- ◆ **Contentment with little support** - His gratitude for even minimal help from partners in the gospel (Phil. 4:15-18) reflects another aspect of the simple life.
- ◆ **Renouncing social and theological status** - Paul counted his heritage, privileges, and achievements as loss for the sake of Christ, considering them rubbish in light of Christ's coming (Phil. 3:4-7). His sacrificial service among the Gentiles and the poor is the supreme example of simplicity in action (Gal. 2:7-10).

May God help us to reflect this same simple life today. The three models of simplicity-Elijah among the separated people, the apostles among the traditionalists, and Paul and Barnabas among the Gentiles-stand as enduring examples for us. As we continue to pay the price of suffering for the revival of the nations, let us commit to living simply: using our talents and resources to build a compassionate society, where the poor find freedom, where the needy experience dignity, and where the sick is healed in the name of Christ.

Bible Translation for Minority language Groups

Origin of languages:

According to the Biblical account of Genesis Chapter 11 verses 1 to 9 human beings were divinely endowed with the knowledge of different languages. Secular linguists believe that language evolved from simpler to complex forms as humans acquired speaking skills imitating sounds in nature. However, a careful analysis of the phonology, morphology,

grammar and sentence structures of languages shows that languages of more primitive ethnic groups are linguistically more complex than those of developed modern communities. This shows that if languages had evolved and developed through human experimentation and imitation of sounds heard in nature it wouldn't have been possible for primitive societies to come up with such complex patterns of phonology, morphology, grammar and sentence structure.

Rich diversity in languages:

We celebrate the rich diversity in God's creation such as differences in our facial features, our fingerprints and the huge variety of animals, plants and insects. We should similarly not forget that there are thousands of languages spoken the world over. The country with the highest number of languages is Papua New Guinea which is estimated to have 840 languages spoken by small and large tribal communities. The next most linguistically diverse country is Indonesia with about 711 languages followed by Nigeria with 517 languages. India stands fourth in the list of linguistically diverse countries with about 453 languages. The 2001 census lists a total of 356 languages in India of which 22 languages are listed in the 8th schedule. The 356 languages recognised by the

2001 census does not include languages spoken by communities with a population of less than 10,000. This implies that many languages spoken by small tribal communities have been left out. According to the 1961 census the total number of languages spoken in India is 1652. This includes languages spoken by small tribal communities and probably dialects which cannot be technically classified as separate languages. Linguistic diversity needs to be preserved since it is language that primarily gives a community its cultural, social and historical identity.

The argument that minority languages will soon vanish:

The argument against the need to translate the Bible into minority languages spoken by relatively smaller number of people suggests that these languages would soon give way to more dominant languages spoken by the majority population. The fact however is that even small diaspora groups living within India away from their original homelands for generations and having assimilated the culture and language of the majority population haven't let their mother tongue die mainly due to the strong socio-cultural and family bond among them. In the Indian context languages dying away is an exception rather than the norm.

Proficiency levels: Mother tongue versus Second language:

When one has grown speaking one's mother tongue it can be expected that he or she would have greater competence in comprehending and speaking the mother tongue than in the language spoken by the majority population which he or she learns as a second language. Haryanvi is spoken by the natives of Haryana and linguistically it is very close to Hindi. I have lived in Haryana for more than 30 years and have observed how even educated people speak with greater confidence and fluency in Haryanvi than in Hindi. When class 11 and 12 students stage a play in Hindi for their school annual function, I have noticed that they learn their parts by heart and it shows when they perform on stage. Whereas when the same class students stage a play in Haryanvi, they deliver their dialogues with such confidence and spontaneity that they even add to what is in the script.

Impact factor: Mother tongue versus Second language:

Granting that a particular minority language group is equally proficient in the language of wider communication the emotional impact and appeal of the mother tongue cannot be equalled by the second language. In Acts 21st chapter Paul is arrested. In Acts 22:2 Paul addresses the crowd in Aramaic language. He could as well have spoken in Greek which the crowd would have understood but when they heard him speak in their mother tongue the uproar ceased and people listened to him quietly.

The Identity factor:

People do have multiple identities like the identity of religion, nationality, profession, peer group etc. That which endears a person to another of his own group and the most defining factor in this context is a person's linguistic identity. One feels closest and safest in the company of another person speaking one's mother tongue especially when outside one's native geographical boundary. Once I asked a Haryanvi gentleman what he would consider the most defining aspect of his identity as a Haryanvi person. Without any hesitation he responded 'My language'.

The process sequence in a Bible translation project:

Earlier, cross cultural personnel committed to the task of Bible translation would choose a minority language with need of Bible translation and move to the location where it was spoken, learn the language and translate with the help of a native speaker who would be designated as 'translation assistant'. The current approach however is to train native speakers of the language to be translators in order to complete the work much faster and to ensure that the translation sounds more natural than when done by a cross-cultural translator.

Socio-linguistic Survey:

Before deciding on whether a particular language has translation need what is known as socio-linguistic survey is undertaken. The purpose of this survey is to find out the size of the population speaking the language, geographical areas it is spoken in, the various dialects of the language, the extent to which the speakers of the language are fluent in the majority language of the area, the dialect that is acceptable to all the other dialect speakers of the language and the extent to which these dialects differ from one another, the vibrancy of the language and its use in various domains like the home domain, public domain, religious domain, academic domain etc. A cross-cultural translator undergoes a three month long basic course where one is taught how to phonetically record and analyse the grammar, the sound system of the language, and is imparted practical techniques to learn the language. If the translation is to be done by a native speaker, he or she is taught how to study the sound system of the language so as to be able to determine which vowels and consonants are to be represented in the alphabet of the language. He or she also undergoes training in basic translation principles.

First Draft:

Once the pre translation process namely the survey and training are completed the translator begins making the first draft of the New Testament book chosen to be translated. Usually before beginning to translate biblical content, booklets containing paraphrased stories from the Bible are translated. Before translating or making the first draft of biblical books the translator studies the meaning as sought to be conveyed by the author of the book. This is called an exegetical study. For this the translator uses commentaries and other translation resources which are now available in digital formats.

Checking with a Native Speaker:

The translated draft is checked with a native speaker of that language verse by verse to see if the meaning is rightly understood by him or her and to ensure that the rendering sounds natural in the native language. This also helps to check if there are elements in the translation that are taboo in the culture of the language speakers. This ensures that the translation does not end up being unacceptable in that culture. The first draft is now updated in the light of comments and suggestions made by the native speaker.

Back Translation of the Corrected Draft:

Now this corrected draft has to be checked by a translation consultant who obviously does not

know this language. Hence for him to be able to understand the translation the draft has to be back translated word by word into English or any other language that the consultant knows. It is through this back translation that the consultant checks the translation in the presence of a native speaker.

Consultant Check:

Once the consultant has gone through the back translation he might either call for a face-to-face consultant session or the check through a video conference call or may even choose to send his comments, questions, observations and suggestions through an online platform asking the translator to respond to these. The translator may accept the consultant's suggestions or give him clarification justifying the way he has translated and also convey the response of the native speaker to the consultant's questions. If the consultant is satisfied with the response of the translator he may go ahead and approve the translation for publishing. The translator then updates the draft in the light of the consultant's observations.

Printing and Publication:

After checking the final draft for consistency in spelling and the translation of key terms in the scripture like 'Grace,' 'repentance', 'salvation' 'Apostles' etc. the translator hands over the final draft for printing. After two or three rounds of proof correction and pagination it is ready for publication. Agencies like the Bible Society of India publish the final approved translation.

Distribution and Scripture use Promotion:

The translated scriptures have to be distributed among the speakers of the language and its regular use ought to be promoted in the established congregations among the people group. If the literacy rate in the language group is very low adult literacy programmes need to be conducted to teach people to read. The translation team alone cannot do this promotion of translated scriptures and a joint initiative is needed with church planting teams playing a major role.

Recording of translated scriptures in multimedia formats:

The printed scripture is now rendered in audio and even in video formats which can be accessed by people most of whom are now in possession of smartphones which can be used to listen to translated scriptures. This benefits even people who otherwise do not know how to read and write.

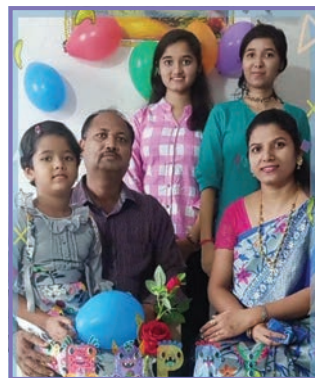
Mission focus

FMPB Ministry: FMPB began ministry here on **15 Feb 2022** under **Rev. Rameshwar Dhayal**, focusing on the Satnami people. The Satnam Panth, founded by **Guru Ghasidas (1820)**, emphasizes equality, discipline, and monotheism in "Satnam." Giraudpuri Dham (birthplace of Ghasidas), with its 77m Jaitkham (victory pillar) tower, is their key pilgrimage site.

Challenges: The Gospel faces hurdles like alcoholism, early marriages, divorce, and opposition from Guru movements.

Amidst this Naresh Kumar & Sukrita became the first believers, healed from COVID-19. In Bathelpur, Bisrampur, and Gadeshpur, believers faced death threats, but God sent police protection and preserved their lives.

Rev. P. Vinu was born on 28th February 1988 to Late Mr. Paramanatham and Mrs. Sushela in Kanyakumari district. He has one elder brother and one younger

sister. In his early years, he did not have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and often refused to attend church regularly, despite his mother's persistent encouragement. On Sundays, he would deliberately keep himself occupied with fieldwork instead of going to church.

When he was in the 8th standard, Rev. Vinu attended a spiritual meeting at Nalumavadi, where the Lord spoke to him through the verse, *"The yoke shall be destroyed because of the anointing"* (Isaiah 10:27b). Convicted of his sins, he sought God's forgiveness and accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior.
