The Called Ones

Charles Spurgeon once said, “*If God calls you to be His servant, do not lower your standards by becoming a king.*” When God calls a person to serve Him, no earthly crown or position can equal that honor. True greatness is not found in power, wealth, or recognition, but in humble obedience to God’s divine purpose.

This truth is evident in the lives of many of our ministers who faithfully serve the Lord in various capacities within our organisation. When God called them, some were teachers, some held government jobs, others were highly educated or well settled. Yet, as the Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 3:8, they counted everything else as loss for the sake of obeying God’s call. Even in humble service, their calling far exceeds any worldly title.

Throughout Scripture, God calls people by name. He personally called Samuel, Moses, Mary, and Paul, and through them He impacted nations. In Isaiah 43:1, the Lord declares to Israel, “*I have called you by name; you are Mine.*” The God who redeemed His people not only called them, but also revealed the purpose of that call, as described in Isaiah 43:1-14.

A Personal Calling (verses 1-2):

Though addressed to the nation of Israel, this calling is deeply personal. God called them by name and assured them of His promises, revealing Himself as faithful and unchanging.

A New Identity (verse 4): Despite Israel’s failures and loss of identity, God restored them in grace, declaring them precious, honored, and loved—an identity given, not earned.

A New Name (verse 7): God placed His name upon them, affirming their status as His children, with the responsibilities, blessings, and identity that come with it (2 Chronicles 7:14).

A Holy Task (verse 8): Though once slaves, God called them into His redemptive mission. The work does not depend on human strength, for God Himself goes before His servants (verses 5-14), shaping surrendered lives into effective instruments.

Witnesses for God (verses 10 & 12): Only those who truly know and believe in the God who calls them can bear faithful witness through their lives.

This year, God has given such a calling to our organisation—a personal calling, a calling by name. Let all who have received this call respond in obedience, recognizing that God’s call is not merely an invitation, but a divine command worthy of our wholehearted response.

Support children who have no resources to go to the school or college. Support missionaries who share God's love and bring change in the society. FMPB is involved in sending missionaries and supporting children for their school and college education. Support the children. Support the missionaries. This will bring transformation in the society

4. Don't lose track of the most important things in your life. Spend more time with your parents. Spend quality time with your children. Spend time with your friends. Spend time with your relatives. Allocate your time and resources appropriately. Relationships are more important than many other things in life.

5. Have spiritual disciplines in your life - time of prayer in secret, time of fasting in secret, time of giving in secret. Then you will have abundant rewards on earth as well as in Heaven.

From the small beginning of one obedient woman Amy Carmichael and one small child came a 'model village', (Donavoor) complete with its own simple facilities and even a hospital to serve the sick. CALLED *By* NAME

Called by Name, Sent with Purpose

“But now, thus says the LORD, He who created you, O Jacob, He who formed you, O Israel: ‘Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; you are Mine.’” (Isaiah 43:1)

As we step into a new year of ministry and witness, I greet you in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. A new year is not merely a turning of the calendar; it is a sacred invitation from God to remember who we are, to whom we belong, and why we are sent. The year theme drawn from Isaiah 43:1 “*You are called*” comes to us as both assurance and summons.

These words were first spoken to a people who were weary, displaced, and uncertain about their future. Yet, God did not begin with strategies or instructions. He began with identity: *“I have called you by name; you are Mine.”* This is where all true mission begins not with our plans, but with God’s gracious initiative.

As a mission movement committed to participating in God’s redemptive work across India and beyond, FMPB enters this year reminded that our calling precedes our activity, and our belonging precedes our sending.



Called by the Creator and Redeemer

Isaiah 43:1 reveals the deep theological foundations of calling. God identifies Himself as the One who *created, formed, and redeemed* His people. These are not poetic repetitions; they describe the full scope of God’s relationship with us.

To be created by God affirms our dignity. To be formed by God affirms our purpose. To be redeemed by God affirms our worth. Mission that is disconnected from these truths becomes burdensome and fragile. But mission rooted in identity becomes joyful obedience.

For us as a mission fellowship, this is crucial. We are not merely an organisation managing programmes. We are a redeemed community, shaped by God, called to reflect His glory among the nations of our land. Our workers in villages, towns, campuses, hospitals, and institutions do not serve because they are merely assigned, but because they are called.

“I Have Called You by Name”: The Personal Nature of God’s Call

The God of the Bible is not distant or anonymous. He calls by name. Moses was called from the burning bush by name.

Samuel heard his name spoken in the silence of the night. Zacchaeus was called down from a tree. Saul was confronted personally on the road to Damascus.

In our Indian context, names carry meaning, lineage, and identity. To be called by name is to be recognised, valued, and entrusted. Many of our missionaries can testify that God met them personally-sometimes through Scripture, sometimes through a sermon, sometimes through a crisis-and called them into His service.

I recall a young believer from a rural background who first heard the Gospel through a village evangelist supported by FMPB. As a first-generation Christian, his family resisted his faith. Yet, through prayer and patient mentoring, he sensed God's call to serve among his own people. Today, he ministers faithfully in a region where Christ was once unknown. God still calls by name, even in the most unlikely places.

Fear Not: Called in the Midst of Uncertainty

God's call in Isaiah 43 begins with a command: *"Fear not."* This is significant. Calling does not remove challenges; it gives courage to face them. Israel was still in exile when God spoke these words.

Our mission context today is not free from uncertainty. Social changes, economic pressures, persecution and opposition to the Gospel, natural calamities, and fatigue among workers are real. Many of our missionaries serve in difficult terrains, sickness prone areas, hostile environments, and spiritually resistant regions, often with limited resources and little recognition. Some face rejection, threats, or prolonged suffering simply for remaining faithful to Christ.

Yet, the promise remains unchanged: *"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you."* God does not promise an easy path, but His abiding presence. He walks with His servants through floods and fires, sustaining them by His Spirit and strengthening them for faithful witness.

We have witnessed this reality firsthand through the costly experience of our own FMPB missionaries who have served in hostile and persecution-prone contexts. In certain regions, opposition to the Gospel intensified, threats were issued, and in some instances, the mission community endured irreparable loss, including the loss of precious lives. Yet, even in the face of grief, fear, and uncertainty, our missionaries chose faithfulness over fear. Through prayer, sacrificial obedience, and steadfast witness, the Gospel continued to take root. In moments when circumstances were overwhelming and the cost painfully real, it was the unshakable conviction of God's call that sustained them and bore testimony to Christ, even through suffering.

Called for Witness

Isaiah 43 moves from assurance to assignment: *"You are My witnesses"* (v.10). Election leads to vocation. God calls His people not to withdraw from the world, but to witness within it.

This reminds us that the Church exists for God's mission. FMPB's calling is aligned with this biblical mandate, to bear witness to Christ through evangelism, discipleship, compassion ministries, leadership development, and partnership with local churches to transform communities and nation building.

Our emphasis this year continues to be:

- Strengthening indigenous mission initiatives
- Nurturing holistic mission that integrates word and deed
- Mobilising the next generation for God's mission
- Deepening partnerships built on trust, prayer, and accountability

We are called together not as isolated individuals, but as a fellowship responding to God's mission in India's diverse and complex realities.

Discerning our calling in God's Mission

Calling is discerned over time, in prayer, in Scripture, and in community. Very often, God's call becomes clear as we walk in obedience. As a mission body, we must intentionally create spaces where calling can be heard, tested, and affirmed especially among youth, women, and emerging leaders. Many of our women missionaries testify that God used ordinary faithfulness-teaching children, visiting homes, caring for the sick, to clarify their calling. God's mission advances not only through the visible and celebrated, but through quiet, consistent obedience.

Let us also remember that calling is not limited to full-time missionaries. Pastors, professionals, teachers, doctors, administrators, and supporters are all called to participate in God's mission through prayer, giving, advocacy, and faithful witness in their contexts.

Called for God's Glory and the Hope of the Nations

The ultimate purpose of our calling is God's glory: "*Everyone who is called by My*

name, whom I created for My glory" (Isaiah 43:7). When the Church lives out its calling faithfully, God is glorified and the nations are blessed.

As FMPB, our prayer for this year is not merely growth in numbers, but depth in faithfulness. May our calling shape our priorities, our decisions, and our relationships. May we resist fear and fatigue, and renew our commitment to God's mission.

Dear Partners in mission, as we begin this year, let us hear God's voice afresh: "*I have called you by name; you are Mine.*" Let us serve not out of compulsion, but out of conviction. Let us go forward not in fear, but in faith.

At this significant moment, I earnestly appeal to all our prayer partners, sponsors, and members to continue standing with FMPB in this God-given calling. Your prayers sustain our missionaries when no one sees their labour. Your generous giving enables the Gospel to reach unreached and underserved communities. Your encouragement strengthens us to persevere faithfully in God's mission.

Mission is not carried forward by those on the field alone; it is accomplished by the whole body of Christ walking together in obedience. As you pray, give, and advocate, you become active participants in the mission to which God has called us as a fellowship.

Let us therefore renew our shared commitment this new year 2026 to pray more earnestly, to give more sacrificially, and to trust God more deeply, so that His name may be glorified and His saving love made known across our land.

BANDE DURGKONDAL

Chhattisgarh *A Brief Overview*



Chhattisgarh, the ninth largest state in India, has a population of around 30 million. It borders seven states and became a separate state on 1 November 2000, with Raipur as its capital. The north and south are hilly, while the central plains are fertile. Gaurlata is its highest point. The state has the third largest forest area in India. Chhattisgarh consists of 33 districts, including major tribal regions like Bastar, Kanker, and Surguja. Chhattisgarh is among India's fastest-growing states. It is rich in resources, holding the third largest coal reserves, and is a major producer of electricity, coal, and steel. Agriculture remains a key occupation, with major crops including rice, maize, millets, pulses, and oilseeds.

With the exception of the hilly states of the north-east, Chhattisgarh has one of highest shares of Scheduled Tribe (ST) populations within a state, accounting for about 10 percent of the STs in India. The tribals are an important part of the state population and mainly inhabit the dense forests of Bastar and other districts of south Chhattisgarh. Chhattisgarh is known for the Karma dance, performed by tribes like the Gonds, Baigas, and Oraons to welcome spring. Hinduism is the dominant religion. The Satnami community, followers of Guru Ghasidas, is significant. Islam is concentrated in urban areas, and Christianity is common among Surguja tribes.

Belief in witchcraft (tonhi) persists in some regions; hence the Tonhi Atyachar Niwaran Act, 2005 was enacted to curb witch-hunting. Chhattisgarh is a unique blend of tribal traditions, natural resources, agriculture, and rapid industrial growth. Its forests, cultures, and heritage continue to define its identity at the heart of India.

Our Ministry in Bande and Durgkondal

Bandé: Bande is the tehsil headquarters in the Kanker district. Durgukondal, located in Uttar Bastar

Kanker, is a culturally vibrant village known for its tribal diversity. The tehsil comprises 150 villages, inhabited mainly by the Oraon, Kanwar, and Binjhwar tribes. The commonly spoken languages include Chhattisgarhi, Hindi, Gondi, and Halbi. The FMPB began its ministry in the Bande field in 2018. The pioneer missionaries were Rev. Vijayan and Mrs. Jebarose. The initial field survey was conducted by T. Vijayan, Babujee Murmu, Kuldeep Singh, and a team of evangelists.

Durgkondal: Durgkondal is one of the tehsils in the Kanker district. The Durgkondal Area Survey was carried out by missionaries from the Allapalli, Ettapalli, and Bande fields-Bro. Arvind Vasave, Bro. Kuldeep Singh, Bro. Babujee Murmu, and Bro. Hosen Jerai-on 28th & 29th December 2022. Durgkondal is located 64 km from the Bande field.

These mission fields lie in the Deccan region of the Central Zone. The major people groups here include the Madiya, Abuj Madiya, and Raj Gonds. Among them, the Madiya tribe, who speak the Madiya language, are particularly receptive to the Gospel. This region is also close to our Etapalli field in Maharashtra.

The field consists of 301 villages, 1 town, and 34,152 houses. The literacy rate is 57%. The people are predominantly animists (spirit worshipers). Most villages lack doctors and have no primary health centres.

Men and women work mainly as farmers and laborers. Only a few children attend school, while others tend cattle. The community is heavily influenced by Naxalism and Maoism. Many people view Jesus as only a healer and deliverer from evil spirits.

Roman Catholic and Pentecostal groups have ministered here earlier. The people are open and favourable to the Gospel, offering little resistance.

Effective ministry approaches include: Film programs, Personal evangelism and though Healing ministries

Ministry challenges in this region include: Magicians, Village priests, Tribal leaders, PESA law supporters and Cultural practices such as living together before marriage, child marriages, and reports of human sacrifices.

Gospel Impact: A powerful Gospel breakthrough began through Chinny Gota, a believer from the Etapalli field. She visited Hettadkasa village for the funeral of her brother's newborn grandson. The child's father had also fallen unconscious during the funeral. Moved with compassion, Chinny Gota told the family: "Why are you dying without Jesus? Look at us-we were also dying without Jesus, but now we are saved."

"Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper."

- Jeremiah 29:7

Her words touched their hearts. Her brother's entire family-along with their sons' families and relatives-came to her village, Rekhnar, and attended the prayer fellowship. They all confessed their faith in the Lord, and a congregation was formed in Hettadkasa. From this village, the Gospel spread to nearby areas, and today this region is known as the Bande field.

To Pray

1. The superstitious beliefs and immoral cultural practices to end.
2. The children to go to schools and also do their higher education
3. Enough hospital, Primary health care centres to be opened
4. The influence of Naxals and Maoism to cease.
5. For a breakthrough for the Gospel among these people.
6. The believers to live a witnessing life and to share the Gospel to their own people when and wherever possible.



Young Generation of India on the Edge

A Call for Prayer & Action

National Youth Day in India for 2026 falls on **January 12, 2026**, marking the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. The week commencing from that day is known as the National Youth Week.

FMPB, founded as a youth movement, carries the responsibility of interceding for India's young generation and nurturing its own next-generation youth to build strong second-line leadership-missionaries, prayer group leaders, and Scan leaders. A recent Evangelical Fellowship of India (EFI-endorsed survey) shows that Christian parents have the greatest influence on youth in following Christ, surpassing spiritual retreats, leaders, friends, and even social media.

India has the world's largest youth population, with 65% under age 35, yet today's youth face unprecedented challenges: unemployment, underemployment, inflation, drug addiction, digital and screen addiction, mental health struggles, suicide, and rising obesity. Rapid socioeconomic change, technological shifts, and new lifestyle patterns have made urban youth life more complex than ever. Around 87% of youth in developing countries like India still struggle with limited access to resources, healthcare, education, and employment.

Meanwhile, 68% of India's youth (15-29) live in rural areas. Large-scale migration to cities in search of work drains rural regions of innovation and manpower, yet migrants often end up in insecure, low-paying urban jobs. Unemployment remains the top concern, with 36% of youth (15-34) identifying it as India's biggest problem. Media reports from April 2025 reveal that 36% of IIT Bombay graduates remained unplaced in 2024, and overall, over 80% of India's unemployed are youth, with young women disproportionately affected.

Drug abuse is rising sharply-1.58 crore adolescents (10-17) struggle with addiction to alcohol, cannabis, or opioids. Excessive screen time and social media usage are causing emotional disconnection, lethargy, and anger. Mental health is deteriorating: over 50% of youth (18-24) report poor mental health, and 41% of suicides involve individuals under 30. Urban obesity is also increasing due to unhealthy diets and sedentary lifestyles.

Prayer Points for India's Youth

Unemployment & Underemployment

1. Pray for God's provision of meaningful jobs for young people, that they may find dignity in work (Ecclesiastes 3:13).
2. Ask the Lord to bless India's economy and open doors for Local skill development, entrepreneurship, and innovation in rural areas.
3. Intercede for young women who are disproportionately excluded from employment, that barriers be broken and opportunities be made equal.

Drug & Substance Addiction

4. Pray for deliverance of youth trapped in alcohol, drugs, and harmful substances (John 8:36).
5. Ask God to strengthen families, churches, and communities to be places of refuge and healing.
6. Pray for protection over children and teenagers, that they may be shielded from early exposure to addiction.

Social Media & Screen Addiction

7. Pray that young people will use technology wisely and not be enslaved by it (1 Corinthians 6:12).
8. Ask God to restore real connections in families and friendships, overcoming isolation and alienation.

Mental Health & Emotional Well-being

9. Pray for healing and peace for youth struggling with anxiety, depression, and distress (Philippians 4:7).
10. Intercede for students under pressure from exams and competition, that they may find strength in Christ.
11. Pray for the church to rise as a compassionate support system, offering hope and encouragement.

Suicide Crisis

12. Pray against the spirit of hopelessness and despair among India's youth (Psalm 34:18).
13. Ask God to comfort families who have lost children to suicide and to bring restoration.
14. Pray for awareness, counseling, and intervention programs to reach vulnerable students, especially in high-pressure academic hubs like Kota.

Obesity & Lifestyle Challenges

15. Pray for wisdom in dietary choices and discipline in lifestyle (1 Corinthians 10:31).
16. Ask God to help youth overcome unhealthy habits and embrace stewardship of their bodies as temples of the Holy Spirit.

This stirred an important question in her heart: "If God gave His only Son for me, what am I doing for Him?"

This led her to surrender her life to God and for mission work, especially for unreached people. Reading FMPB magazine further inspired her burden for tribal ministry and to join the organization with a strong missionary vision and disciplined prayer life. She joined FMPB in 2012 after marriage and completed NIM Jhansi Training.

Together, they served among the Santal tribe in Samsi Field, West Bengal, and later as pioneer missionaries in Itahar Field (2014-2020). Since 2020, they have been ministering in Pakuhat Field, West Bengal.
