A call to Holiness



Many today wonder whether it is possible to live a holy life in this present age. Among today's youth especially, Satan has sown the lie that holiness is unattainable. Yet because our God is holy, He calls us to be holy. One of the unique and glorious attributes of the God we worship is His holiness. The apostle Peter reminds us of God's command: "Be holy, for I am holy" (1 Peter 1:16). Likewise, Scripture declares that God has called us

not to impurity, but to holiness (1 Thessalonians 4:7). This call to holiness is universal—and it is not merely an invitation, but a command. The God who commands holiness also provides the grace needed to fulfill it, for it is His will to sanctify us. Therefore, we are called to surrender ourselves and our bodies to Him (Romans 6:19).

True holiness is not limited to outward appearance; it must be reflected in our thoughts, words, and actions. Living a holy life involves daily battles, but the Holy Spirit faithfully helps us overcome them, enabling us to live blameless lives as we await the Lord (Colossians 1:22).

Thoughts: Many struggles arise in the mind rather than in the body—impure thoughts, pride, envy, and harmful intentions toward others. What we see and hear can shape and corrupt our thinking. Memorizing God's Word equips us to overcome these struggles (Psalm 119:15), and guarding our eyes and ears is essential. Just as removing a spider prevents repeated webs, we must identify and destroy the root causes of sin with God's help (2 Corinthians 10:5). Let us pray daily that our minds may be renewed and reflect the mind of Christ (Philippians 4:8).

Word: Our thoughts find expression through our words and actions. Scripture speaks extensively about the power and responsibility of our speech (Proverbs 12:18, 12:22, 19:9, 16:28, 25:23, 15:1, 26:22-23; Ephesians 5:3-4, 4:31; Romans 1:29-30; 2 Timothy 3:3-5; Matthew 12:36). Since death and life are in the power of the tongue (Proverbs 18:21), holiness in our words is essential.

Action: God desires holiness in our actions as well-loving and respecting others without partiality, helping those in need, and acting justly. We are called to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness (Psalm 96:9). Chosen in Christ to be holy and blameless (Ephesians 1:4), we are disciplined and sanctified so that we may become vessels of honor, fit for the Master's use (Hebrews 12:10; 2 Timothy 2:21). As we serve Him daily, the Lord Himself enables us to live holy lives that glorify His name.

From the General Secretary...

Dear Prayer Partners,

As we step into the second month of the New Year, the early enthusiasm of fresh resolutions begins to yield to the steady demands of ordinary days. This moment calls us beyond mere evaluation of plans and priorities into a deeper posture of listening, listening attentively for the voice of God. For the people of God, a New Year is not simply about turning a calendar page; it is about renewed obedience to the enduring call of Christ. Our Christian calling anchors us in who we are, clarifies why we exist, and reminds us that we have been placed in this particular season of history by divine design, not by chance.

To be called by Christ in India is both a sacred privilege and a weighty responsibility. In this ancient land, rich with spiritual longing, cultural complexity, and historical depth, our calling is intentional and purposeful. Jesus' words resound with clarity and authority: "*You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit, fruit that will last*" (John 15:16). Through the centuries, God has summoned ordinary men and women in India to live lives of extraordinary faith, leaving a gospel-shaped legacy that continues to influence the Church and its mission today.

Christian calling begins with belonging, a belonging to Christ and to His body. In a



society deeply marked by caste, community, and hierarchy, the gospel offers a radically new identity, rooted not in social position but in grace. The ancient St. Thomas Christian community bears witness to the truth that the gospel took root in Indian soil without losing its indigenous character, transforming lives while honouring cultural context.

In India, Christian calling has often been expressed not through public prominence, but through faithful presence. The gospel has quietly advanced through teachers, farmers, nurses, evangelists, artisans, and professionals who embodied Christ long before they proclaimed Him. Pandita Ramabai stands as a prophetic witness to such a calling, responding to God's voice by serving widows and oppressed women through education, advocacy, and sacrificial love. Her life reminds us that Christian calling must engage both the human heart and the structures of society with courage and compassion. This quiet, steadfast witness continues to shape the Church's mission across villages, cities, and institutions even today.

Scripture also sets before us Barnabas as a compelling model of Christian calling. Introduced in Acts 4:36-37, Barnabas sold his land and laid the proceeds at the apostles' feet, teaching us that calling begins with generous surrender. In an Indian context where land, inheritance, and security carry profound meaning, his act confronts us with a searching question: have we placed God's mission above personal gain?

When Saul was feared and rejected, Barnabas stood with him and introduced him to the apostles (Acts 9:26-27). Christian calling, therefore, includes standing alongside the misunderstood, the hesitant, and the newly called especially first-generation believers and those from marginalized backgrounds. Later, Barnabas was sent to Antioch not to control or command, but to encourage (Acts 11:22-24). His ministry teaches us that encouragement itself is deeply missional. In a season when the Indian Church faces pressure, fatigue, and uncertainty, the call to strengthen one another in faith has never been more urgent.

Most significantly, Barnabas invested in the next generation. He sought out Saul and partnered with him in ministry (Acts 11:25-26), and when others lost hope in John Mark, Barnabas chose restoration over rejection (Acts 15:36-39). His life proclaims that Christian calling is not about guarding positions or preserving influence, but about releasing others into the purposes of God.

Throughout history, Christian calling in India has been inseparable from compassionate service. In response to God's call, believers

have established schools, hospitals, homes, orphanages, and relief ministries a visible sign of Christ's love among the vulnerable. To follow Christ in India often involves misunderstanding, exclusion, or even persecution. Yet suffering has never silenced the call of God. The story of the Indian Church affirms that the cross is not the end of the journey, but the pathway to resurrection life. Scripture exhorts us, "*If you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed*" (1 Peter 4:16). Faithful endurance remains one of the Church's most powerful witnesses.

India, therefore, is not only a mission field; it is a mission force. From this land, God is raising missionaries, professionals, and prayer partners to serve among unreached peoples within India and far beyond its borders. Shaped by suffering, simplicity, and perseverance, the Indian Church carries a distinctive gift to the global body of Christ. The mandate of Acts 1:8 continues to echo from our towns, villages, and cities to the ends of the earth.

In this light, the revival of the **Gospel Ratham ministry** is far more than the renewal of a program; it is the rekindling of a missional heartbeat within the Church. Just as Philip encountered the Ethiopian on an ordinary road and Paul proclaimed Christ in marketplaces and public arenas, the gospel is meant to move beyond church walls into the everyday spaces where people live, work, and journey. In this spirit, Navaneethar Annan and his team are prayerfully planning two Mission Expos, one in Chennai and another in Tirunelveli, with the vision of awakening burden, imparting clarity, and

mobilizing God's people for His mission. In a time when many remain unreached and hesitant to enter church buildings, the Gospel Ratham ministry offers a culturally rooted, relational witness through music, testimony, Scripture, and compassionate presence by proclaiming Christ with humility and conviction. We earnestly urge God's people to uphold these initiatives in sustained and fervent prayer, trusting the Lord for deep impact and lasting fruit.

As we look ahead, our Christian calling also summons us to prayerful discernment for the days to come. We humbly request the Church to uphold in prayer the forthcoming **Management Committee and Executive Committee meetings**, as well as the **National Planning Conference 2026**. These are not merely administrative gatherings; they are sacred spaces where we seek the mind of Christ for wise leadership, faithful stewardship, and renewed obedience to God's mission.

We also thank God for His steadfast faithfulness in the Utkal region, which joyfully marks its **Silver Jubilee of ministry**. Seeds sown in faith have borne fruit through perseverance, sacrifice, and prayer. As we commemorate this milestone, we look back with gratitude and forward with expectancy, asking the Lord to deepen and multiply the work He has begun.

In this spirit of remembrance and anticipation, a **Mission Consultation** will be convened to prayerfully reflect, discern, and chart the future direction of the ministry. May this consultation be led by the Holy Spirit, anchored in Scripture, attentive to

present realities, and bold in envisioning new pathways for gospel witness. We invite the wider Christian community to stand with us in earnest prayer, confident that the Lord who has led us thus far will continue to guide us for the glory of His name and the blessing of the nations.

Finally, we call upon all our prayer partners to remember before the Lord our missionaries who serve faithfully in difficult and often hostile contexts. Many labor under the shadow of persecution, misunderstanding, and opposition, carrying the weight of the cross in quiet obedience. We earnestly seek your prayers for God's divine protection over their lives and families, protection from violence, false accusations, accidents, and every form of harm. We also ask you to pray for physical health, emotional strength, and spiritual resilience, that the Lord would shield them from sickness, renew their strength daily, and fill them with unshakeable peace and courage. May the God who calls and sends also guard and sustain His servants, granting them boldness to witness, grace to endure, and joy to persevere until Christ is glorified through their lives.

Let us, therefore, pray without ceasing, discern with humility, and obey with courage for the call of God still resounds, and the harvest before us is great.

The Call to Holiness



The Holiness of Our God

Since separated the first man from a holy God. Yet the God whom we worship remains holy forever. Scripture declares, "There is none holy like the Lord" (1 Samuel 2:2), and again, "Who is like You, glorious in holiness?" (Exodus 15:11). In Isaiah's vision, the seraphim cry out continually, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts."

In Genesis 17:1, when Abraham was ninety-nine years old, God commanded him, "Walk before Me and be blameless." From the beginning, the Lord has set apart His people for holiness. As Paul writes, "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him" (Ephesians 1:4). God Himself declares, "You shall be holy to Me, for I the Lord am holy, and have separated you from the peoples, that you should be Mine" (Leviticus 20:26).

The Word of God is called the **Holy Bible**, and the Spirit who leads us is the **Holy Spirit**. Those who truly served the Lord were remembered as "holy men of God" (2 Kings 4:9). This is the highest testimony a servant of God can receive.

1 The Call to Sanctify Ourselves and Be Holy (Leviticus 20:7)

Even before the Law was given, men of God lived holy lives. Job is believed to have lived even before Abraham. God Himself testifies about him: "That man was blameless and upright, one who feared God and shunned evil" (Job 1:1). Job, in chapter 31, bears witness to his own walk before God.

Joseph, who came after Job, declared in Genesis 39:9, "How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" He chose holiness even at the cost of imprisonment.

These men lived holy lives centered on God in a sinful world-without the written Law. Their lives show us that holiness is possible through fellowship with God.

Likewise, the believers of the early church lived holy lives, even when many of them could not read the Scriptures. Their lives were shaped by obedience, prayer, and the fear of God.

2 A Call to Live Holy Lives Like Him (1 Peter 1:16; Leviticus 20:26)

Our standard of holiness is not other people-

it is Christ Jesus Himself. "Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps" (1 Peter 2:21).

The Pharisees compared themselves with others and justified themselves as righteous (Luke 18:10-12). But Paul, when he stood before God, declared, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief" (1 Timothy 1:15).

John writes, "If we confess our sins..." -including himself among those in need of grace. Ezra, Nehemiah, and Daniel, in the ninth chapters of their books, confessed sin not as spectators but as participants, identifying themselves with the people who had transgressed God's commands.

When we compare ourselves with others, we may appear holy. But when we compare ourselves with God, we see our true condition-and are driven to humility and repentance.

3 He Is the God Who Sanctifies Us (Leviticus 20:8)

For us who live in the New Testament era, God has given us the Holy Spirit-this is a great privilege. At the same time, we are living in the last days. Jesus said, "Because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold" (Matthew 24:12). Paul warned that "perilous times will come" (2 Timothy 3:1-5).

Yet God has not left us helpless. By the power of the Holy Spirit, He sanctifies us. "When He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13). Jesus prayed, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth" (John 17:17).

We are commanded to keep His statutes and walk in them (Leviticus 20:8). "The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes" (Psalm 19:8). A holy life is possible only through obedience to the Word of God.

4 Called to Live with Holy Adornment (Psalm 96:9)

After bathing and cleansing ourselves, we comb our hair and wear clean, well-prepared clothes. Men dress neatly; women dress modestly. When attire is appropriate, we appear presentable.

In the same way, humility, love, righteousness, compassion, and truth are the adornments of holiness. Isaiah speaks of Christ, saying, "Righteousness shall be the belt of His loins, and faithfulness the belt of His waist" (Isaiah 11:5). Revelation 22:11 exhorts us: "He who is holy, let him be holy still."


Why Are We Sanctified?

We are sanctified so that God may use us in this sinful world. He desires us to be vessels fit for His purpose-holy and pleasing to Him.

A vessel that is used must be cleaned repeatedly. A vessel that is not used may remain untouched in a cupboard for display. As children of God, we are used daily in His service; therefore, daily sanctification is essential.

Those who truly seek the Lord go outside the camp to the tent of meeting (Exodus 33:7). May we, each day, dedicate ourselves afresh to holiness, so that the Holy God may work through our lives for His glory.

How to Live in the PRESENCE of GOD

The main goal of my life is to enjoy the presence of God—a lesson He Himself taught me. More important than any service I can offer is learning to delight in His presence and strengthen my inner person each day. To share the gospel, help believers grow, comfort the hurting, and live holy in a sinful world, I must first live continually before God.

For years, I rose early to pray, not yet understanding the power of meditation. But when God led me to prioritize meditating on His Word, I found it easy to sense His presence. My heart was ignited before Him, and in that openness, I could draw near and enjoy Him deeply.

Each morning, I began to meditate on the New Testament—reading, studying, and receiving the nourishment my soul needed, not to teach others but to feed my own inner life. During meditation, confession, praise, and prayer flowed naturally, yet I kept my focus on receiving spiritual nourishment.

Before this, I often struggled to feel God's presence in prayer and found it difficult to stay focused. Now, the moment I begin reading and meditating on Scripture, I sense Him near and can speak with Him about whatever He brings to mind.

Meditating on God's Word is the golden key that opens the delightful place of His presence. God invites you to enter this sublime and transformative experience.

CANCER Awareness, Prevention, and Hope

Cancer is a group of diseases characterized by the uncontrolled growth of abnormal cells, with the potential to invade or spread to other parts of the body. There are more than 100 types of cancer that affect humans. Among them, the most common are breast cancer, lung cancer, colorectal (colon and rectum) cancer, and prostate cancer. Globally, cancer continues to be a major public health challenge. Nearly 33% of cancer-related deaths are linked to lifestyle factors such as tobacco and alcohol consumption, obesity, inadequate intake of fruits and vegetables, and lack of physical activity. Other contributing factors include certain

infections, exposure to ionizing radiation, and environmental pollutants. Infection with specific viruses, bacteria, and parasites is responsible for approximately 16–18% of cancers worldwide, while about 5–10% of cancers are attributed to inherited genetic defects. Cancer is one of the leading causes of death worldwide. In 2020 alone, it accounted for nearly 10 million deaths—almost one in every six deaths globally. According to the Global Cancer Observatory (GLOBOCAN), there were an estimated 19.3 million new cancer cases worldwide in 2020. India ranked third in cancer incidence, after China and the United States of America. Alarmingly, GLOBOCAN projects that cancer cases in India will rise to 2.08 million by 2040, marking an increase of 57.5%.

World Cancer Day World Cancer Day is observed every year on 4 February to raise awareness about cancer and to encourage its prevention, early detection, and effective treatment. It was established on 4 February 2000 at the World Cancer Summit Against Cancer for the New Millennium, held in Paris. The primary aim of World Cancer Day is to significantly reduce illness and death caused by cancer. It also serves as a global platform to unite the international community in addressing the injustice of preventable suffering from cancer. The day is officially observed by the United Nations. World Cancer Day plays a crucial role in challenging misinformation, raising awareness, and reducing the stigma surrounding cancer.

Across the globe, hundreds of events and initiatives are organized each year to express solidarity with those affected by cancer and to promote collective action. World Cancer Day Themes World Cancer Day follows a three-year thematic cycle, with each theme guiding awareness campaigns, publications, and outreach programs worldwide. Some of the notable past themes include “We Can. I Can.”, “I Am and I Will”, “Close the Care Gap”, and “Not Beyond Us.” The theme for the years **2025–2027 is “United by Unique.”** This theme emphasizes placing people at the center of care and their personal stories at the heart of the conversation, recognizing that every cancer journey is unique while reinforcing the strength of unity in care and compassion.




Trail Blazers

In the early hours of the morning, Dr. Marcus Whitman rode into the mission compound at Waiilatpu- "place of the rye grass." A decade earlier, it had been a wilderness inhabited only by wild animals and Native tribes. Now, thanks to the Whitmans' efforts, the land was transformed with cultivated fields, orchards, livestock, and a gristmill (to grind corn).

Yet this transformation symbolized a deeper cultural clash. On one side of the clearing were the lodges of the Cayuse tribe (Native American tribe), from which echoed the muffled cries of mourning. On the other side, five covered wagons marked the wave of Westward expansion.

In between stood Marcus and Narcissa Whitman. They had left rural New York to bring the Gospel to the Northwest. When they first arrived, some of the Cayuse welcomed them, giving up witchcraft, violence, and the burial of unwanted children alive. They learned farming, raised cattle, and cared for their families.

Dr. Mark was born on 9 April 1822 in Federal Hollow, New York. He was a medical missionary who worked with his family among the Cayuse Indians near modern-day Walla Walla, Washington. His wife, Narcissa, had committed herself to missionary work

before they were married. The couple, who had married in 1836, left rural New York and were appointed missionaries by the ABCFM, traveling by sleigh, canal boat, horse-drawn carriage, and on foot over the Rocky Mountains, and established a mission near Wala Walla on May 25.

Medical ministry: Not all the Cayuse were grateful. Fear and suspicion toward the Whitmans grew-especially as a deadly measles epidemic swept through the Cayuse. Many died because the natives were less immune to disease than whites. But the people suspected that Whitman was poisoning them (the Cayuse people knew that Whitman had poisoned the wolves he was hunting). Despite Dr. Whitman's best efforts, many died. According to Cayuse custom, if a medicine man (tewat) failed to heal, he was to be killed. So, the natives wanted revenge on Dr. Whitman. Resentment also grew with the steady arrival of white settlers from the East. Whites were accused of taking over their lands and horses. Despite knowing that their lives were in danger, the Whitmans did not back down from their commitment.

However, they established a hospital, school, and orphanage.

The Whitmans had already given up everything-wealth, home, family, friends, health-for their mission work. Narcissa was in poor health, and their only child, Alice Clarissa, had drowned in the Walla Walla River at age two. Despite all this, they were willing to give their very lives for the Cayuse Indians they had come to love.

The Massacre: On November 29, 1847, He sent Narcissa to bed and took her place caring for sick children-both white and Native. Neither knew these would be their final hours. A group of hostile Cayuse along with their chief arrived at the mission house requesting medicine. Dr. Marcus Whitman, ever compassionate, reached for his bag to help, but was struck from behind with a tomahawk (a kind of axe) and killed. Gunfire erupted, and chaos ensued.

Narcissa Whitman, hearing the gunshot, did not think of herself but protected the Sager orphan girls, bolting the door and gathering them close. Despite her efforts, a bullet struck her shoulder through the window.

Outside, Eastern immigrants were killed. Andrew Rogers, a ministerial student, rushed to defend the compound and was mortally wounded. Yet, he managed to get Narcissa and the girls into a loft, holding attackers at bay for over an hour with a broken gun barrel.

Eventually, wounded Narcissa was deceived with promises of safety. On her way out, she passed her dying husband, who assured her of his love and faith in God. As she exited, she was shot multiple times and killed.

Narcissa had given her all-nursing, teaching, and sharing her faith with the Cayuse. She remained faithful unto death.

The massacre continued, killing all able-bodied men. Women and children were abused and held for ransom nearly a month before being rescued in a dramatic series of events.

After several years, justice was served for the Whitman massacre. Some murderers were tracked into the Blue Mountains by a Christian Nez Perce chief and killed in battle. Five, including those who killed Marcus and Narcissa Whitman, were convicted and hanged by a jury that included Native Americans.

The Fruit of the sacrifice: Was their martyrdom in vain? No. Though Waiilatpu had been obscure, the tragedy made headlines in Eastern newspapers, through which the Whitmans' family first learned of their deaths. Their story sparked a wave of burden for souls across the U.S. Inspired by their courage, many young people committed themselves to Christ's service.

Henry Spalding, a close friend of the Whitmans, returned to mission work and witnessed a spiritual harvest among the Cayuse and Nez Perce. A chief named Timothy became a faithful Christian. The church Spalding founded in Idaho still stands as a tribute to the Whitmans' legacy.

In the U.S. Capitol, a statue of Marcus Whitman stands with a Bible in one hand and medical saddlebags in the other-symbols of his life's mission. Though his care was rejected by some, his merciful sacrifice was not in vain.

What's in your hands? Marcus carried a Bible and a medical kit, tools he used to transform lives, even at the cost of his own. Whatever you hold-money, education, talents, time-offer it for the Kingdom's sake. Invest it wisely for the Kingdom. Surrender it to God's purpose.

MATYA CHURCH HISTORY

Telo Field,
Santhal Sahibganj Region

General Information

Matia is a medium size village located in Borio Block of Sahibganj district, Jharkhand. As per constitution of India and Panchayati Raaj Act, Matia village is administrated by Sarpanch (Head of Village) who is elected representative of village. Bada Raksois the village panchayat of Matia village. Matia village has lower literacy rate compared to Jharkhand. In Matia village, most of the village population is from Schedule Tribe (ST). Schedule Tribe (ST) constitutes 46.09 % of total population in Matia village. There is no population of Schedule Caste (SC) in Matia village of Sahibganj. It is in the Telo mission field. It comes under Bishunpur pastorate.

The Beginning

From October 15th 1993 to December 31st Mr. Sudhaharan family and Franklin family were staying in Borio and Mr. Elias was teaching them Santali language to read and to know the Santali grammar. Then to speak in Santali language they both were sent to Baditola village. There with the help of Bro. Jebaraj they learned to speak in Santali language in January and February 1994. They were allotted mission fields by the end of March



1994. Bro. Franklin was given Kathuva field and Bro. Sudhaharan was given Telo field.

Telo field was opened on 1-4-1994. Sudhaharan family was the first missionaries of this field. On 9th April native evangelist Johan Hansda joined them with his family. They stayed in a rented house in Borio village. Later they and the evangelist family after one month went to Kherwa village and lived in rented houses. During the time of Sudhaharan as missionary of this field, in 1994, gospel was shared to Matia village.

FMPB ministry



Elizabeth Murmu

Elizabeth Murmu, wife of the first believer Samuel Soren (formerly Somai Soren), was the first believer in the village. Both accepted Christ and were baptized on 21-08-1996 by Missionary Sudhakaran after six years of childlessness, and God blessed them with a son. Around thirty people, including seven families, were baptized with them. Later, Kuru Soren's healing from a scorpion bite and

Elizabeth's own healing from a leg wound through prayer led many more villagers to accept Christ.

Worship Services

For four years the worship was conducted in the shed of the Daniel Soren's house. It is in Manji Tola. 35 people gathered in the worship place. Saul Murmu the father of Elizabeth Murmu was conducting the worship service. He was the believer of CNI church. As her husband was from another religion, he and his family members took baptism. Later the worship services were shifted to Jaher tola as more believers were from there.

Church Construction

The Land for Church construction was given by Barnabas Murmu.

His testimony: I am Barnabas Murmu from this village. I donated three to four katta of land for the church because I saw believers with no place to meet. Earlier I was a drunkard and village leader who led people to gurus and opposed Christians-even planning pujas and to kill the first believer (Samuel Soren's father-in-law). My father fell seriously ill despite sacrifices and a relative died. A Christian song- "there will be sufferings in life but there will be peace"-touched me and my family; we all became Christians. Now we cultivate our land with enough grain, and I was elected village leader and serve as the church's first elder.

Church construction began in 2006 without opposition, though transport of materials was difficult due to the lack of roads. Built

with a concrete roof, the pucca church was completed with believers' help, who worked for Rs. 30 a day when others earned Rs. 60. Missionary Jeevan Ranjan oversaw the work, and Rev. Devadoss dedicated the church on 20-04-2007 for the glory of God.

Dedication

In October 2009, Matia church sponsor Mr. Stephen Raj from Kerala visited Matia church. Believers had arranged the program very grandly. More than 400 people gathered for the meeting. The visitors were three people and they were very happy to see the program and the reception given to them. People from five tolas of Matia and five families from Kuval attend this church, with 20-50 regular attendees. Worship is led by elders Barnabas Murmu and Immanuel Kisku. Evangelists visit monthly, missionaries 3-4 times a year, and two families were baptized last year. Offerings include thanksgiving, testimony, first fruits, tithes, and handful rice.

Testimonies of Healings

- My name is Elizabeth Murmu (formerly Sanjali Murmu). I suffered from a severe leg injury and sought help from a local Oja Guru (witch doctor), who said an evil spirit was punishing us for living together without marriage and demanded costly animal sacrifices for healing. Unable to afford them, we were helpless. Then we heard the gospel of Jesus Christ, believed in Him, and accepted Him as our Savior. When the missionaries prayed for me, I was completely healed.
- On 13-12-1997 Marthina from Matia village visited missionary's house. She told missionaries about a sore on her chest giving much pain. She asked them whether to go to doctors for taking treatment. Missionary advised that prayers to be done

by the believers in her village. Missionaries prayed for her in their home and sent her to her village. On next Saturday, she informed missionaries that she was prayed by the congregation believers and she received complete healing from God.

- Sibu Soren and his wife Maku Hansdak followed Sapha Dharam, worshipping the sun and other deities, avoiding meat, salt, and believed that the Ganges could wash away sins. They often suffered from spirit attacks and remained without food. Their son, returning from work in UP, urged them to accept Christ after seeing no healing through their faith. Though initially angry, they finally agreed. Evangelists Johan Hansda and Paulus Murmu prayed for them twice-first they resisted, but later they were calm, ate food, and were healed and delivered from evil attacks. On 29-6-1998, they confessed their faith.
- Barnabas Murmu's blind bullock received sight when he accepted the Lord and prayed with faith.

Missionaries who worked in this field

The pioneer missionary of this field was Sudhakaran, who served from 1995 to 1999. He was followed by Jeevan Ranjan, who served from 1999 to 2007. After him, C.H. John ministered from 2007 to 2011, and since 2011, Kennedy Singh has been faithfully serving in this mission field.

The Small Groups ministry

The Small Groups ministry, started in 2004 and led by Martina Soren in Jet Tola, met every Tuesday and Friday for two hours to pray for missionaries, evangelists, the sick, and their families. They also visited homes to share the Gospel and pray, resulting in many

healings and new believers added to Christ's fold.

Irrigation project

In May 2010, an irrigation project guided by Dr. Edward Raja was completed in Matia village. Following this, the government launched a lift irrigation project in Matia and nearby villages. Dr. Raja encouraged believers to participate, and with united effort, the project succeeded. Government officials visited, praised the achievement, and appreciated the missionaries' role, noting that such cooperation could benefit other Santhal and Malto villages.

Blessings

God has raised 56 worship groups and 20 worshiping groups, with three temples under construction. Five local evangelists' families and 84 church elder families are serving faithfully. Around 163 children are studying in two-day care centres.

Prayer Points

1. That the Gospel may reach every village under the current ministry.
2. For basic amenities-clean water, electricity, healthcare, and education -to reach more needy villages.
3. For protection from diseases such as malaria, typhoid, tuberculosis, and kala-azar.
4. As many men migrate for work, pray for local job opportunities and strengthened families.
5. For a spiritual revival among the youth and for them to rise as church leaders.
6. For an end to young deaths caused by malnutrition.
7. For complete deliverance from alcohol addiction among the people.
